Jacqueline Gafford (director) is honored to be working again with Scott Myers and Westport Center for the Arts in collaboration with Inplay Productions. Jacqueline is particularly excited about working with Scott Myers on this important and meaningful play *Bottle Of Fire*. In October 2021 Jacqueline Gafford directed and acted in her original script *Dark Was Their Journey*. Jacqueline has also directed *Stick Fly* with Kansas City Black Rep. Ms. Gafford directed the staged reading of the moving new musical *WOKE* by Keith Andrews. Ms. Gafford has worked closely with Westport Center for the Arts directing *JFK: A Ghostly Evening, Bighorn's Secret, Stealing Kandinsky, Moon's Language*, and *Oracle of the Ozarks*, all written by Scott Myers.

Gafford has been a fixture on the Kansas City theatre scene for over 30 years. Originally from Shreveport

LA, Jacqueline attended Grambling State University. Grambling was awarded the first Norman Lear Award for comedy thru the American College Theatre Festival for playwright Judi Ann Mason's *Livin' Fat* and the first Lorraine Hansberry Award for Judi Ann Mason's *A Star Ain't Nothin' But a Hole in Heaven.* Jacqueline was an original cast member in both productions. As a junior at Grambling State, she was nominated for the Irene Ryan Scholarship as part of the American College Theatre Festival for her portrayal of the chorus in Grambling's production of Jean Anouilh's *Antigone.* She was also a winner of the Barbara Jordan Speech Tournament for Oratory.

Jacqee (as she is known to her theatre friends) worked at Theatre for Young America for four years as an artist in residence. While there she directed, acted, stage managed, taught, and wrote plays in collaboration with Artistic Director Gene Mackey. Jacqee has also acted and directed at other Kansas City area theatres: Unicorn Theatre, The Coterie, UMKC Theatre Dept, Lawrence Community Theatre, Rockhurst University Theatre. At Just Off Broadway Theatre, she has acted and directed with InPlay Theatre Company, for which she is the founding Artistic Director, and with JOB resident company KC Melting Pot Theatre, with Harvey and Linda Williams.

Jacqueline is a member of Actors' Equity, and SAG-AFTRA, professional theatrical and screen professionals unions.

At the Unicorn, Jacqueline performed in Flyin' West, Having Our Say, Old Settler, and Intimate Apparel. She also directed Betrayal of the Black Jesus, Crowns, The Women of Brewster Place, and Her Hair Went with Her. She directed Flyin' West and Inherit the Wind at Lawrence Community Theatre. At Rockhurst University Theatre she directed The Wiz and Wedding Band.

With her company InPlay Theatre Productions, Jacqueline has directed her original scripts such as *Harlem Knights, Nothing Comes to Sleepers*, (Sleepers was also commissioned and performed at Southeast Missouri State University) and performed the title role of Barbara Jordan in *Journey With Barbara Jordan*, written in collaboration with Gene Mackey. Jacque also directed the Lorraine Hansberry play *Raisin the Sun,* which is one of her favorites.

Jacqee is proud to have written and directed the original script, *Dark Was Their Journey*, which is about the lives of the widows Coretta Scott King, Betty Shabazz and Myrlie Evers-Williams after the death of their husbands.

Scott Myers and Jacqueline Gafford are collaborating on a new and exciting script which will be produced at JOB in October and November 2022. It is entitled *ONLY THE WOUNDS AND WEAPONS HAVE CHANGED*. DON'T MISS IT. THIS PLAY FIGURATIVELY JUMPS OUT OF THE LIBRARY BOOK STACKS.



Frances Farah (production manager, costume designer,

properties designer) is truly happy to be working with Westport Center for the Arts again, particularly on this exciting new play by Scott Myers, *Bottle of Fire*. Fran worked as Production Stage Manager with Jacqueline Gafford on her original script *Dark Was Their Journey* in October 2021. Fran was the Production Stage Manager on two of Scott's other plays, *Moon's Language* and *Oracle of the Ozarks*. Fran loves a good mystery and also loved working on *Stealing Kandinsky*. It was a real joy.

Fran Farah has been working in Kansas City theatre for about 40 years. Fran received her MFA in Theatrical Direction in the first MFA class for the UMKC

Theatre Department under Dr. Patricia McIlrath. Fran went on to found the New Directions Theatre Company in Kansas City with several colleagues from her MFA program, such as Penelope Weiner, Sharon Grossheart, Vickie Little, and Lynn King. With New Directions she either directed or produced such plays as *Tiger at the Gates, Toys in the Attic, Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?*, and *Jacques Brel Is Alive and Well and Living in Paris.* Fran met Jacqee Gafford when she directed *Edward II* by Christopher Marlowe. With other colleagues they founded InPlay Theatre Company in 1999. InPlay Theater Company has produced plays such as *Othello, The Rainmaker,* and *A Raisin in the Sun,* as well as the collaborative work, *Booth: Is There a Murder Here* written in collaboration with Penny Weiner. Fran also worked with Jacqee on the original works *Harlem Knights, Grape's Vine,* and *Nothing Comes to Sleepers,* which were written by artistic director Gafford.



Scott Myers (playwright) is thrilled to be working again with Jacqueline Gafford. Scott has written ten major stage plays. His first play, *JFK*: A Ghostly *Evening*, (directed by Jacqueline Gafford and Harvey Williams) was staged at the Just Off Broadway Theater in 2013. Kansas City Star theater critic, Robert Trussell wrote of the play: "When a first-time playwright creates a work that packs a punch, the natural response is to find out what else he has tucked away on his computer. "JFK: A Ghostly Evening," is impressive. The show is buoyed by serious intent and a provocative view of history. Too many playwrights have only theater as a frame of reference. Myers comes at the art form from the real world."

Since, then Scott Myers has staged *"Mo Motley and the Money Gods"* at the Just Off Broadway Theater (2016) *The Moon's Language* (2018, directed by Jacqueline Gafford), *Oracle of the Ozarks* (2018, Jacqueline Gafford) and *Stealing Kandinsky* (2019, funded for playwriting by Arts KC Inspiration grant).

Scott Myers is current Board President of Westport Center for the Arts (founded in 2008). He is an ordained Presbyterian minister, is currently senior minister at the historic Westport Presbyterian Church. He received a \$45,000 grant from Lily Endowment in 2005 to study "arts and spirituality". He is a graduate of the University of Michigan (B.A., History, English) University of Dayton (Counseling) and Eden Theological Seminary (M. Div.). He is grateful to his family for their support– Jeanne Reiss, M.D. his spouse, his three adult children, nine grandchildren, one great grandchild, and everyone at Westport Presbyterian Church.

ONLY THE WOUNDS AND WEAPONS HAVE CHANGED by Jacqueline Gafford and Scott Myers

Friday, October 21 through Sunday, November 6, 2022 9 Performances at Just Off Broadway Theatre

This original Black History play features many lesser known people who have played key roles in the struggle to completely liberate people who were captured and shipped from Africa to America to be sold as slaves. The play dismantles what author James Baldwin called "the white falsification of history," showing instead the whole truth by creating dialogues that could have taken place between people who were actual contemporaries. The playwright team has chosen many lesser known, yet significant people, relationships, and events to assure they aren't erased from history, instead are celebrated and understood.

Examples of scenes that deepen audience understanding are:

A scene about a lynching in Omaha, Nebraska.

A dialogue between jazz singer/pianist/forgotten film super star, *Hazel Scott*, and mystic/writer, *Dr. Howard Thurman*

A scene with Fannie Lou Hamer & Ida B. Wells

The deep friendship and artistic collaboration between *James Baldwin*, writer, and *Beauford Delaney*, painter, both LGBTQ arts pioneers. (scene also includes *Robert F. Kennedy* and *J. Edgar Hoover*)

Two Kansas City people are included:

Leon Jordan, pioneering Black politician and police detective (in a scene with *Bayard Rustin,* who organized the March on Washington)

Lucille Bluford, pioneering journalist who put the Kansas City Call newspaper on the map (in a scene with *Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth* of Birmingham, Alabama and *Bull Connor*, Birmingham, Alabama sheriff)
